Precept message

Council tax is a mandatory tax paid by residents to the district council which is in turn distributed to local and county councils. This money is known as a precept, and we rely on it to finance a wide range of services and initiatives that directly benefit the community.

The precept is utilised to provide essential services such as litter collection, maintenance of local infrastructure, green routes, and parks. Cultural activities, recreational facilities, and community events are also made possible through the allocation of these funds.

And when compared to other Towns, it becomes evident that our Council offers


a more varied array of services than other Town or Parish Councils.

We have confidence that these figures illustrate outstanding value for money, especially given that no Town Council services have been terminated. 
TAX BAND D

Hanger Farm Paddling Pool

Following many years of general wear and tear, this year we decided it was time to bring improvements to Hanger Farm Paddling Pool. In agreement with New Forest District Council (NFDC), these works are being paid for using developers' contributions.

Works have been underway since the start of May and have involved breaking up of much of the original concrete to strengthen the base of the pool and alter the existing gradient.

Some amendments have been made to the operating system and supply and return pipework.

However, the most noticeable change is that of the surfacing which is more like that of a play park being somewhat softer underfoot. We have also improved accessibility by implementing a beach like ramp and supporting rail into the pool and have added a raised island feature near the centre of the pool.

After the successful completion of the project, our residents have been delighting in the transformative improvements, and we have received fantastic feedback regarding the diligent efforts to finish it before the summer's end.

Furthermore, we hope that residents and visitors alike are pleased with improvements and wish you all a lovely and safe, splashy future.

The Totton & Eling Tennis Centre, established in 2004, is managed by a dedicated family team in partnership with Totton & Eling Town Council.

What we offer

- eight outdoor floodlit courts
- available for casual hire up to 72 hours in advance
- online court booking totton.tennis/court-hire
- junior and adult **coaching programme**, with around 350 local participants
- membership packages available, allowing play in box leagues and teams

How it works

Online court hire is available to everyone, providing a convenient way to secure a court. Once a booking is confirmed, you can use the supplied pin number to access the court gate. Floodlights will switch on automatically, where required. Bring your own racquets and balls.

Our popular **group coaching programme** specialises in introducing new children and adults to the sport, and then focuses on retaining them for the long-term. We offer a simple introduction to tennis, completely free-of-charge, which includes an initial assessment with a coach, followed by a taster session of a suitable group. Please email to book.

Tennis club membership offers enhanced social and competitive playing opportunities, including free court usage when playing with other members, 30-day booking priority and box leagues. Membership payments are via monthly direct debit.

We offer a safe welcoming space for young individuals to socialise, receive support, learn new skills, and engage in activities of their choice. Our sessions provide games, activities, refreshments, and snacks, with our team available for guidance and assistance.

Join us for activities like pool, table tennis, and arts and crafts. Each evening, we tailor sessions based on young people's preferences. We aim to create an environment that caters to their interests.

Additionally, we run a sexual health clinic every Monday from 4.00pm to 6.00pm, led by a certified NHS nurse. Its primary focus is to provide comprehensive care and support related to sexual health, addressing specific needs and concerns that individuals may have. On Tuesdays, we have "GROUNDBREAKERS," where young participants learn skills like fire-lighting and gain knowledge about the environment. They actively contribute to transforming and preserving the garden, encouraging our young people to protect and care for our world.


