This will provide stabilisation for a bank area, and wildlife corridor. Planting of disease resistant Elm trees across the Town has also now taken place. In total 766 trees were introduced in the last planting season, via community planting supported by volunteer groups. Box tree moth issues are being

			addressed and arrangements are being made to replace with an alternative species.
