There is no need for you to provide any information, the payment is automatic, and the DWP know if you are eligible or not based on their records.

Reporting Domestic Abuse to Crimestoppers

Domestic abuse will affect 1 in 4 women and 1 in 6 men in their lifetime. Crimestoppers are encouraging you to learn the signs to spot, so that if you do see or hear something, you can speak up and tell them what you know, 100% anonymously – guaranteed.

As a bystander, family member, colleague or friend you may feel helpless when you know someone is a victim of domestic abuse. Whilst ultimately the victim will need to make the decision to leave the relationship themselves, we encourage you to report your suspicions. Remove valuables from vehicles

Reports of theft from vehicles can increase over the warmer months, especially in public car parks when people are enjoying outside spaces. Even items of little value may tempt a potential thief to break into a vehicle, to see what else there may be worth stealing.



- Where possible park your car in an attended car park, or look for public car parks approved by the <u>Park</u> Mark Scheme.
- Do not hide valuable items. Take them with you or leave them at home

Every day, people across the UK get calls from unknown numbers, and many of these turn out to be scams.

National Trading Standards are promoting Phonely, the free reverse phone lookup tool helping you find out who's behind those mystery calls. In July 2025, the community reported thousands of suspicious numbers, helping everyone stay safer. They also add these reported numbers to a blacklist, so all their clients are protected from known scam calls.
