Create a Task & Finish Group to establish a green agenda that includes developing a resilience policy.	Task & Finish Group formulated in November 2022. Holding bi-monthly meetings. Develop and promote green transport plans.	Meetings held with Hampshire County Council. Proposals for improved green infrastructure in the Town awaited.	Liaise with Hampshire County Council and progress feasibility studies for more cycling and walking options in the Town.	Electric vehicle charging points were planned for the Town Council's facilities for public use, subject to receiving relevant funding. Unfortunately, funding was not awarded. Looking at alternative funding. Points with solar charging options now being looked at for funding from green monies. Town regeneration partnership with District and County Councils meetings have taken place, with some positive proposals. Projects are subject to funding from the Freeport. Working towards the formulation of a Town Centre Framework masterplan and investment plan. A contractor has been appointed, and a draft plan is being formulated, which will include improved cycling and walking. Lockable cycle units are being considered for the Town. Developing a Town Local Cycling

			and Walking Infrastructure plan in conjunction with the Neighbourhood Plan. Draft Masterplan is due to go for public exhibition in January 2026. Feedback will be fed into the plan and draft discussions
Ensure that all Council buildings are as energy-efficient as possible and that energy is not wasted through unnecessary heating and lighting.	All staff instructed to be aware of energy wastage. Further green incentives being investigated. Thermal imaging survey is scheduled for implementation in all Council buildings in the first quarter of 2025, for energy reduction identification. Actions have now commenced at Council facilities on recommendations from the thermal imaging survey, including replacement of fire doors thus also addressing fire safety regulation. Evaluations of repairs/refurbishment requirements have now been implemented at all salient buildings. Any further energy saving measures will be addressed and actions formulated. On-going.

Installation of rain water recycling tanks at allotments sites. Rain water storage tanks have been installed at all four allotment sites within the Town. These aid to enable sustainable water management and lower carbon footprint. These have

			been installed, where possible, next to buildings to enable the rain water running from the roofs to also be utilised. Allotment holders are able to use the recycled water for their produce, and the Council are subsequently able to save on mains water usage and thus cost to the community. On-going review of useage.
Plan for green community in a neighbourhood plan, including increased tree planting, renewable energy, reduced carbon omission housing development and safe walking/cycling routes.	Climate emergency motion approved in September 2023. Council already uses renewable energy. Has purchased electric vehicles.	Investigate any further carbon reduction areas. Continue with green transport plan, as above.	Electric Council vans purchased, replacing diesel vehicles. Improved cycling and walking in the Town incorporated in Neighbourhood plan, 5 year strategy and regeneration plan. Successful bid to expand the Community Orchard at Bartley Park funded through HCC scheme was confirmed in February 2024. This will provide stabilisation for a bank area, and wildlife corridor. Planting is completed. Additionally disease resistant Elm trees have been planted across the Town and the planned planting of Hornbeams trees at Eling Quayside have been temporarily postponed pending a meeting with AB Ports in relation to that area. In total 766 trees were introduced in the last planting season, via community planting supported by volunteer groups. Box tree

			moth issues are being addressed, and have been replaced with Green Spire plants. Neighbourhood plan draft is imminent for completion and submission. A further 21 trees have now be planted at Eling Quay, and other areas in the Town. Increase in planting budget has been approved to further enhance the area, and replanting opportunities for AFC area are being explored.

Funding is now secure for the installation of rain fed storage systems at each of the allotment sites. These systems consist of tanks, on stands, which will recycle water via collection of rainfall and from the rain draining from the toilet block roofs and used by allotment holders to water their produce. Implementation of the tanks installation is imminent.
