STATEMENT FROM THE CHAIR OF THE COUNCIL



Last year, I outlined a number of factors that would have a significant impact on Totton and Eling. Since then, we have learned the outcome of the Local Government Reorganisation, which will see Hampshire County Council and New Forest District Council abolished by 2028 and replaced by five new Unitary Authorities across Hampshire and the Solent. The Government has decided that Totton and the Waterside will be separated from the rest of the New Forest and incorporated into a South West Hampshire Authority alongside Southampton and Eastleigh. The Town Council has formally objected to these proposals and continues to believe that Totton and Eling should remain aligned with the New Forest. However, unless a legal challenge succeeds or the Government changes its position, this reorganisation is expected to proceed. Considerable work is already underway to determine how services currently provided by different Councils can be integrated within a single Unitary Authority. It also remains unclear how the new authority will engage with and respond to the views of local Town and Parish Councils. At the same time, housing development pressures continue to grow, particularly to the north of Totton, where additional sites are being identified for future development. This forms part of the Government's wider agenda to increase housing delivery across the New Forest. With limited suitable land available

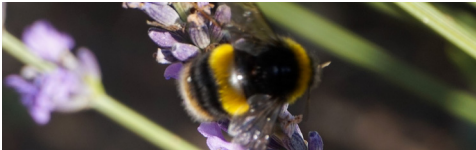
elsewhere, Totton and Eling remain especially vulnerable to further development pressures. The Town Council is committed to protecting the character and identity of our community wherever possible. To support this objective, it has spent several years preparing the Totton and Eling Neighbourhood Plan. Although the Plan must still complete a number of statutory stages before it can be formally adopted, its successful implementation will establish locally determined priorities for protecting important infrastructure, community assets, and key sites within the Town. The Council is also determined to resist development that would erode the strategic gap between settlements, particularly proposals that could effectively merge Eling and Marchwood. Against this backdrop of significant change and uncertainty, the Council will continue to safeguard the qualities that make our Town a special place to live and work. We will maintain our support for local community and resident groups, provide high-quality recreational and sporting facilities, and continue to deliver the amenities and services upon which residents rely. At the same time, we will work constructively to ensure that Totton and Eling secures the greatest possible benefits from the new Unitary Authority arrangements.

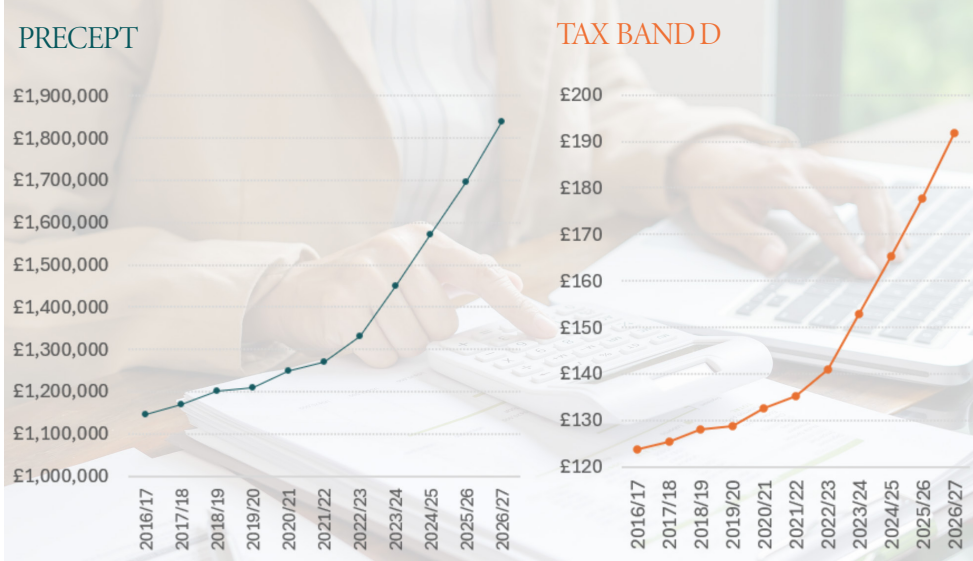

PRECEPT MESSAGE

Council tax is a mandatory tax paid by residents to the District Council which is in turn distributed to local and County Councils. This money is known as a precept, and we rely on it to finance a wide range of services and initiatives that directly benefit the community. The precept is utilised to provide essential services such as litter collection, maintenance of local infrastructure, green routes and parks. Cultural activities, recreational facilities and community events are also made possible through the allocation of these funds.



Our extensive range of services sets us apart from many other Town and Parish Councils. Below are two graphs showing the precept money we have received, and the Band D tax that residents have paid over the past ten years. Over the past three years, the average increase in the Town Council's share of your Council Tax – the part that funds local facilities and services provided by the Town Council – has been just 27p per week. We have confidence that these figures illustrate outstanding value for money, especially given that no Town Council services have been terminated. Furthermore, in the past year, the Council has introduced numerous new and enhanced services. This newsletter highlights the extensive range of services administered by the Town Council, whilst keeping costs down to our residents through lower precept increases.

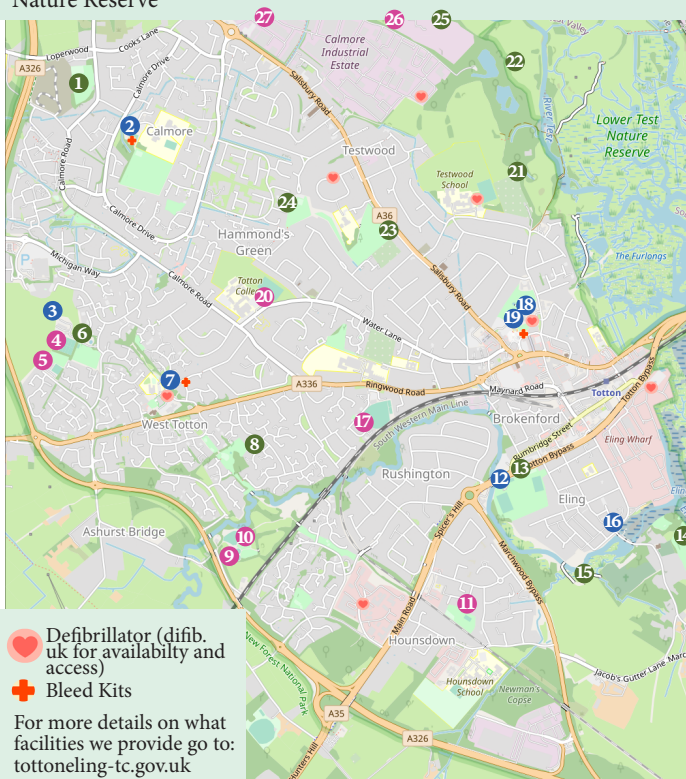

It's important for residents to voice their opinions, ask questions, and participate in the decision-making process for their community. This year, the Local Government Reorganisation was discussed and the impact it will have on the Town and the associated Councils.

CLIMATE AND NATURE

Over the past year the Council have been actively introducing projects and practices to not only help reduce our carbon footprint, but to also assist in the education for the enhancement of biodiversity and the nature prosperity in the Town.

Environmental and sustainability initiatives:

- Rewilding scheme offering residents free core rewilding seeds that will encourage wildlife into gardens and help boost nature's journey through the Town.
- Increased planting budget to support further greening efforts.
- An additional 21 trees have been planted at Eling Quay and other locations across the Town.
- Cycling and walking green routes have been improved to encourage sustainable travel.
- Hedgehog highway gates were available at the Civic Centre and the hedgehog poster competition took place in local schools.
- Annual Carbon Footprint Reports are compiled for monitoring.

The Eling Tide Mill Experience comprises the Tide Mill with gift shop, the Toll Bridge with riverside walks and the adjacent Visitor Centre. Within the Centre, there is a Discovery Room, with numerous artifacts and interactives, the John Chandler room (for hire) and our Café.

OUR GRADE II* LISTED MILL

Following extensive work to enable safe milling, November 2025 saw our first flour production in 3 years. The Tide Mill produced wholemeal flour that was available to purchase in both the Mill shop and Café, which proved very popular.

Tides permitting, the public were able to view the mill in operation in demonstration mode. This was facilitated by the miller, along with the volunteers.

There will be more opportunities to observe the flour production after completion of the planned phased 2 works to renovate the Mill. Milling and demonstration dates will be announced on our website in 2027.



EVENTS held in 2025-2026 included an Easter Trail around the boardwalk, an Ask an Archaeologist Day, our annual Crabbing Conservation event, a Halloween Pumpkin Hunt and our Christmas Market with a Father Christmas Grotto. We also developed and continue to hold, a fortnightly Craft and Chatter group. These events have been a success in the local community and beyond, which is something we will continue to build on.

THE CAFE is ideal for morning coffee, light lunches or afternoon tea. We offer a daily specials menu which is influenced by our customers' tastes, as well as speciality teas, coffees, cakes and sandwiches. The full menu is available on the ETME website.

THE TOLL BRIDGE and our well-liked toll keepers have continued to be a popular feature, interacting with visitors and locals alike, sharing the history of the Mill and the local knowledge.

THE BOARDWALK was refurbished this year, with parts of the boardwalk replaced, and anti-slip strips added to the bridge. This continues to be a favourite and much used aspect of the ETME.

THE MEMBERSHIP SCHEME is available for the ETME and applies to households living in SO40 2, 3, 7, 8, 9 and SO40 4 Marchwood areas.

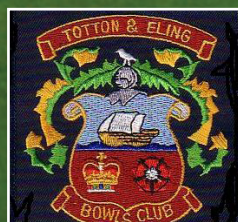

GARAGE

Your Space at The Garage provides a safe, welcoming space where young people can relax, have fun, build friendships and be themselves. It's a place where they can feel heard, try new experiences and access support from trusted Youth Support Workers whenever they need it. Every session is shaped by the interests and needs of the young people who attend. Alongside opportunities to socialise, young people can take part in a wide range of activities, including cooking, arts and crafts, pool, table tennis and other creative and recreational activities, helping them build confidence, learn new skills and connect with others in a positive environment. Regular sessions also support young people to develop the knowledge and skills they need for the future, covering topics such as education and employability, sexual health and healthy relationships, and emotional and physical wellbeing. By combining learning with enjoyable activities, we create opportunities for young people to grow, develop resilience and achieve their potential.

Sexual health clinic - the first Tuesday of every month

On the first Tuesday of every month, from 4pm to 6pm, we host a confidential walk-in sexual health clinic delivered by a qualified NHS nurse. Young people can access free support and advice, including emergency contraception, contraception, contraceptive implants, condoms, HIV testing, pregnancy advice and testing, and sexual assault support. Through mentoring and regular training, participants are supported to grow as role models while gaining valuable experience for their future. As part of the wider Youth Options charity, we also offer a Youth Leaders programme, helping young people build confidence, develop leadership skills and make a positive difference within their communities. Through regular mentoring and training sessions, participants are supported to grow in their role, gaining valuable experience while being encouraged to reach their full potential.
